# **Encouraging Development**

The PDCIS experience is being used as a model for social projects supported by Odebrecht Organization's companies. An example of this is the creation of the Program to Support Economic and Social Development (PADES) in Lunda Sul province, Angola, on the African continent. This initiative is the result of a partnership between the Lunda Sul Government and Sociedade Mineira de Catoca an Angolan mining company formed by

Odebrecht, Alrosa, Daumonty and Endiama. PADES was conceived to follow the educational and productive strand of the PDCIS, which encourages agricultural production (cassava and fruit) and fish farming. Some programs are already underway, such as an exchange of agricultural and fishing specialists who are receiving training in Brazil, resulting from a partnership between Catoca and the Odebrecht Foundation.



### **International Recognition**

TÜV Rheinland in Brazil – a company whose principal focus is the safety and quality of products, systems and services in various fields – certified the Odebrecht Foundation's work, which is promoted in the Southern Bahia Lowlands, through its Certificate for Best Practices in Corporate Social Responsibility. This certification guarantees that the institution develops socially correct practices in its

operations and when interacting with local communities.

According to TÜV's final report, "the Odebrecht Foundation's strategy follows the United Nations' principle of integrated development ('help for self-help'), providing technical and logistical support and capacity-building for cooperative members, instead of ready-made solutions."



#### **Acquiring Experience**

The Rural Family House of Presidente Tancredo Neves (CFR-PTN) has been striving to contribute to the development of young rural entrepreneurs for the past decade. The first steps were taken on August 2, 2002, when rural community associations from the Bahian municipality of Presidente Tancredo Neves came together to create the Rural Family Association. One hundred students are currently enrolled, and a further 150 have graduated

from CFR-PTN, which uses a special method called Pedagogy of Alternance – the young people spend a week studying full-time at the Family House, with classroom and field activities followed by two weeks on their farms, applying the new knowledge acquired.

Since its inception, CFR-PTN, together with the Presidente Tancredo Neves Rural Producers' Cooperative, has formed a series of loyal partnerships. Whether financial, political or































































technical, support from these social agents has enabled this educational unit to enhance its activities.

The Rural Family House of Igrapiúna(CFR-I) is marking its fifth anniversary. Following the CFR-PTN teaching model, the institution has already helped groom 39 local development agents and has been serving 65 new rural entrepreneurs in 2012. They study subjects such as rural administration, soil, perennial crops, processing of animal and plant-based products, and the basics of cooperativism, environmental

education and youth protagonism.

The Institute of Sustainable Development of the Southern Bahia Lowlands (IDES), which is celebrating its 15th anniversary, has launched a new website (www.ides.org.br - only potuguese). Internet users can find out more about the history of this institution, which was created in 1997, and follow its timeline. The site demonstrates the main characteristics and specifics of the Southern Bahia Lowlands, presenting all the municipalities which comprise the region.







## Among the Top Hundred in Brazil

By achievement of the Sebrae Top 100 Handicrafts Award, the Pratigi Environmental Protection Area Rural Producers' Cooperative (Cooprap), located in the Southern Bahia Lowlands, is now on the list of the 100 best handicraft production units in Brazil. Craftswoman and Cooprap's president Creuza Amorim traveled to Rio de Janeiro to receive the award.

Selected from among 1,800 nominees, the Cooperative was the only group from Bahia to gain certification in the third edition of

the Top 100 awards. The items produced - such as baskets and mandalas made from piassava straw and fiber – will display the award's seal for three years, and the Cooperative's products will be promoted in a **Brazilian Support Service for Small Businesses** (SEBRAE) catalog. Cooprap will also have the opportunity to exhibit its members' products at major sporting events, such as the Confederations Cup in 2013 and the World Cup in 2014.







#### **Boost for Production**

Presidente Tancredo Neves Rural Producers' Cooperative (Coopatan) members celebrated the 12th anniversary of their organization's foundation in August with the opening of a Fruit Pre-Processing Unit (UPBF). This project, which received funding from Brazilian Development Bank (BNDES) for its construction, will strengthen both the conservation and shipment to market of crops like bananas and pineapples.

At the opening ceremony, Coopatan's

president Ednalva Santana and BNDES
Department of Mutual Economy analyst
George Teixeira untied a symbolic bow,
and guests were invited to visit the unit.
"I am proud to be part of this partnership
and of attending such an important event,"
George observed. Also representing the
Brazilian Development Bank (BNDES) at the
ceremony were engineer Simone Moraes
and Department of Mutual Economy lawyer
Mateus Ramos.









### **Digital Inclusion**

The Pratigi EPA Intermunicipal Consortium (CIAPRA) has made it possible to include two Bahian municipalities in the Digital Cities pilot-project: Nilo Peçanha and Piraí do Norte. Run by the Ministry for Communications' Department of Digital Inclusion, Digital Cities enables municipalities to modernize their administration through the installation of infrastructure to interconnect public institutions, the training of civil servants and

the creation of free internet access areas for local residents.

The initiative's partners include the Ministry of Planning, National Economic and Social Development Bank, Telebras (Brazilian Telecom), and the National Institute of Metrology, Quality and Technology, among other institutions. In partnership with the State of Bahia and the Odebrecht Foundation, CIAPRA is one of the PDCIS's founders.







# **Community Mobilization**

Providing information on civic spirit and citizenship, preventing and combating drug abuse, giving advice on nutrition, oral health, leishmaniasis, dengue and first aid, Brazilian Army's officers have visited 33 communities in the Pratigi EPA (Environmental Protection Area), located in the Southern Bahia Lowlands. The lecture program began in February 2012 and benefited about 2,350

people in the first half of the year.

The 47 talks given by June form part of the Social Civic Activities (ACISOS) calendar, which will be completed by the end of 2012. The ACISOS program has been carried out in the Southern Lowlands for six years through a partnership with the Army, and has received support from the Pratigi EPA Guardian Association (AGIR) since 2009.



#### **Transformational Motivation**

On account of successful experiences at its Medicinal Plant Garden project, State College Youth House (CECJ), which is located in Igrapiúna, Bahia, has received the Bahia Quality Management Award from the Bahian Association for Competitive Management, in recognition of the school's administration. Students have been learning how to grow medicinal plants, make natural home remedies and share their knowledge with their communities since 2010. The project

currently benefits 381 people in the region. CECJ students also have another reason to celebrate. Their high school is on the list of the ten finalists for the 12th Volunteer School Award. This is a Bandeirantes Radio and Itaú Social Foundation initiative which seeks to encourage and give recognition to educational institutions responsible for social projects that encourage their students to engage in volunteer work.
